FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

ASSESSMENT NOTICES – Assessment notices were mailed out March 27 for all property owners in the Town of Strasbourg. During revaluation years, the appeal period is open for 60 days. If you wish to appeal your assessment, you will have until May 31 to do so.

INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS – In January of 2017, the Town was awarded 2.58 million dollars for expansion of our lagoon project. We will be proceeding with the project this year, with expected start date in May and completion by late fall. We will also be expanding our Water Treatment Plant by adding an additional reservoir to increase capacity. We are hoping to commence this project in June and be done by the fall. Together, these two projects will allow for community growth and sustainability for years to come.

SASKALERT APP

If you have not done so already, we are strongly encouraging residents of Town to **download the SaskAlert app** on their phones.

SaskAlert is the Government of Saskatchewan's emergency public alerting program that provides critical information on emergencies in real time, so you can take action to protect yourself, your family, and your property.

An emergency alert issued though SaskAlert will let you know:

- what the emergency is,
- where it is happening,
- provide instructions for you to follow to stay safe, and
- advise you when the incident is over.

While the Emergency Management Organization (EMO) Committee will still provide door to door notices about Precautionary Drinking Water Advisories, the Town will also start utilizing this service for this type of emergency, as well as any others that arise.

COMPARATIVE WATER RATES

To give you a better idea as to where Strasbourg stands in comparison to other communities regarding water and sewer rates, a cross-section of municipalities was taken, including municipalities located near us, municipalities with similar population, and various other municipalities around the province and compared them with Strasbourg. This data comes from the Government of Saskatchewan and SaskWater's most recent publication "Average Water and Sewer Cost for Saskatchewan Communities as of August 31, 2016" (found here: http://publications.gov.sk.ca/documents/313/95835-

This publication is based off of the **average** of **7000** gallons per household **per month**. This does not take into account the type of water system each community uses.
