#### FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

**INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS** – In December of 2017, the lagoon upgrade was completed and the evaporation cell is now operational. Council is pleased with how the project progressed, and appreciated the professionalism of the contractors and engineers involved. However, Council is happy to have such a large, labour-intensive project off the docket so that they can focus their efforts on our water treatment plant reservoir expansion. Because of unforeseen events, the reservoir expansion project was delayed in the fall, but now will be commencing in May 2018. We hope to have it finished by late summer. This reservoir will add another 330 cubic metres of treated water storage to upgrade firefighting capacities as well as allow for future growth and development.

NEW DEVELOPMENT – On February 1, Glenna Frizzell and Len Cantin of G & L Developments hosted a meet and greet at the Strasbourg Memorial Hall to propose a concept plan of new development on the north of Strasbourg. Their primary focus is an assisted living facility, but the concept plan also includes highway commercial lots, residential lots, estate lots, and country residential lots. There are plans for walking trails and retention ponds. At the meeting, they handed out a community survey to get opinions and suggestions on the proposed development. If you haven't done so already, please hand in your survey to the Town Office. They are also available for pick-up in the Town Office if you wish to fill one out. Your opinion is important to help shape this development!

## BE A COURTEOUS NEIGHBOUR

This article was recently printed in a previous newsletter, however, with spring upon us, bylaw enforcement concerns tend to increase, so it is included here as a reminder. While these reminders seem obvious, it is worth repeating them:

- Scoop up after your pet, both on Town property and your own.
- Keep your dog on a leash when you are walking – this will keep you and your dog safe, along with anyone else in the vicinity.
- Do not allow your dog to bark continuously outside.
- Do not let your cats out to wander into neighbouring yards
   this is also for their safety.
- Do not drive snowmobiles/ATVs/dirt bikes through parks and other people's yards.
- Keep your yard neat and tidy.
   The Town is offering a free landfill weekend in May. There are people who will cut grass and blow snow for a nominal fee.
   There are people who will pick up scrap metal and appliances for free. Perhaps there is even a neighbour that would help out if physical barriers exist to yard maintenance. There is no excuse for unkempt property.
- Do not burn garbage in your fire pit or cause noxious smoke to interfere with your neighbour's enjoyment of their yard.
- Do not cut Town-owned trees without permission.
- Do not drive recklessly or speed through the community.
- Lastly...talk to your neighbours! If you have an issue, try to discuss with your neighbour first. Sometimes getting the Bylaw Enforcement Officer involved before talking to your neighbour can cause stress and bad relations, when a simple conversation would have sufficed to help alleviate problems.
