FROM THE FIRE CHIEF'S DESK

2025 YEAR IN REVIEW

The Strasbourg & District Fire & Rescue (SDFR) had a fairly busy year with 23 calls for service as well as four inspections and occupancy load calculations.

We had 10 fires including a large farm yard fire. Thank you to Earl Grey Fire Department for the help of mutual aid. We had six motor vehicle collision (MVC) calls, three false alarm calls, two STARS landings, and two EMS lift assists.

SDFR is down in membership as we had some people retire. Currently we are at 24 members. We are always looking for new members we meet the second Thursday and last Wednesday of each month at the Fire Hall.

Our training highlights for the year consisted of a Canadian Pacific Railway mock train derailment, anhydrous ammonia, advanced vehicle extraction, as well as CPR/First Aid. We had six members travel to the Saskatchewan Volunteer Fire Fighters Association (SVFFA) Fall School in Swift Current where they trained on everything from Firefighter Basics to participating in the SVFFA's new LIVE fire training module. Thank you to Canadian Pacific Railway and Prairie Co-op for helping with training.



SNOW REMOVAL REMINDERS

Winter is well underway, and the Town of Strasbourg would like to share a few friendly snow removal reminders to help keep our community safe and accessible for everyone.

Property owners and occupants are reminded that snow should not be pushed onto streets, sidewalks, public spaces, or neighbouring properties. Driveway ridges created during street clearing may be removed by Public Works only when time permits and after higher-priority snow removal has been completed.

Town crews continue to work hard throughout the winter.. Priority is given to main routes, emergency access streets, and select sidewalks before moving on to residential streets, alleys, and other areas as conditions allow. We appreciate everyone's patience during and after snow events.

For those looking to get outside safely, residents are reminded that walking paths are available in the Lions Park and offer a great option for winter walks. As always, proper footwear and extra caution are encouraged when conditions are icy.

Thank you for doing your part to help keep Strasbourg safe, walkable, and welcoming all winter long.


