2024 YEAR IN REVIEW

Happy New Year from the Town Administration and Council! The Town is carrying on with many strategic initiatives including the remote water meter reading system for residential and commercial properties, the development of a new fire hall/regional emergency measures centre, a urban forestry replacement plan, creation of strong economic development tax incentives for residential and commercial development, and a comprehensive recreation plan for the whole community. We had our successful Lions Park Grand Opening in June and are looking forward to continually upgrading the space for all to enjoy.

We want to thank those who donated funds to the Town in 2024, whether it be to the Lions Park, Cemetery, Museum, Memorial Hall, or Fire Department. All donations are tax deductible through the Town and all monies go towards continual upkeep of our facilities.

The Town Council annually gives funds in the form of grants, sponsorships and advertising to volunteer groups and local organizations. The application form is available at the Town Office or online at www.townofstrasbourg.ca. Money is budgeted at the beginning of the year and applications are looked at on a first come, first serve basis.

The Town also gave out its inaugural commercial property renovation grant in 2024. The grant is available to commercial businesses in Strasbourg up to \$5,000 to renovate their storefronts, whether it's new signage, siding, windows, etc. This \$5,000 grant was awarded to the Strasbourg Car Wash & Laundromat for all their recent upgrades. IN OTHER TOWN OFFICE NEWS...

- **ASSESSMENT REVALUATION** - 2025 is the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA)'s Revaluation Year for all assessed properties in the province. This means that every property within the Town of Strasbourg will be receiving an assessment notice. There will be a sixty day appeal period in the spring. Each appeal is \$300.00 per property, but it is refundable if the appeal is successful. Please watch for more information in the next few months.
- **UTILITY RATES** - Beginning in January 2025, the utility rates will increase \$6.00 per quarter.
- **EMAIL NOTIFICATIONS FOR BILLING** - The Town Office is actively collecting emails and updating contact information so that utility notices, tax notices, receipts, etc. can be emailed out to the ratepayers instead of through mail. With the ongoing postal strike, it has become more apparent the need to have this change implemented. As well, it saves the Town money with less postage costs. We are strongly suggesting signing up for this service so that you do not miss your receiving your notices.

SMOKE ALARM & CARBON MONOXIDE ALARM REQUIREMENTS

The *Construction Codes Act (CCA)* of Saskatchewan came into effect January 1, 2022. This was in replacement of the Uniform Building & Accessibility Standards Act (UBASA), which had governed building code for the Province of Saskatchewan for the last few decades. All municipalities are provincially legislated to have building inspectors appointed to enforce the CCA and its requirements.

This is a reminder that **all buildings with a residential occupancy (i.e., sleeping quarters) are required to have carbon monoxide and smoke alarms installed.** This includes older buildings which were initially constructed prior to these devices being required in the previous building code. While the Town will not be going door-to-door to ensure buildings are complying, if a building official or fire inspector is in a residence for any other purpose and notices the required devices are missing, they could write an order requiring the owner to comply. For your own safety and security, it is imperative that you have these devices installed, as well as check them often to ensure they are operational. It could literally save your life!
