2025 TOWN YEAR IN REVIEW

A Year of Growth, Renewal, and Community Spirit

The year 2025 was one of significant progress and resilience for the Town of Strasbourg. With major infrastructure improvements, strengthened regional partnerships, renewed community engagement, and organizational advancements across departments, Strasbourg has continued to position itself as a growing and vibrant community in the Last Mountain region. This Year in Review highlights the accomplishments. challenges, and milestones that shaped our municipality over the past year.

Strengthening Governance, Administration, and Service Delivery

The Town embarked on 2025 with a renewed administrative focus. Early in the year, the IT transition to MuniSoft was completed relieving the CAO's office of internal IT burdens and improving security and efficiency. Website redevelopment continued through the winter, culminating in a successful launch in late spring, accompanied by the rollout of Strasbourg Connect — a mass-notification system that quickly proved invaluable for sharing notices, updates, and the Spotlight newsletter.

The 2024 audit reported no issues, reflecting sound financial stewardship. Assessment work was successful through the revaluation year, with the roll seeing no appeals. Later in the year, Council undertook significant discussions regarding tax acknowledging structure and penalty rates, assessment values and the need to encourage timely payment. Committee structures continued to evolve, with Council examining new approaches to Committee of the Whole meetings improve communication, flexibility, transparency. Governance modernization was also reflected in updates to the Code of Ethics Bylaw.





2025 TOWN YEAR IN REVIEW CONTINUED

Major Infrastructure Projects and Facility Improvements

Hall Wall Replacement & Facility Enhancements

One of the largest undertakings of 2025 was the Strasbourg Memorial Hall foundation replacement — a multistage project that required extensive engineering, tendering, timing considerations for community bookings, and unexpected challenges. By early March, engineering inspections were underway, and by May, the Town was preparing tenders with a planned August start. Work commenced late summer, revealing complexities such as mixed wall materials that required on-site adjustments.

Despite these obstacles, the project progressed steadily, and by the fall, the Hall wall, kitchen, and structural components were fully completed. The Town also seized the opportunity to repave the Hall parking lot and install new tech equipment and bar room improvements (including licensing the facility) - key upgrades supporting future community programming and rentals.

Tree Planting, Park Upgrades, and Green Initiatives

The Town made tremendous strides in urban forestry and beautification. Through collaboration with GreenDrop and federal funding programs, the Town:

- Secured funding for 60 new trees
- Developed a long-term boulevard and park tree plan
- Planted 40 new trees and bushes in the Park and Green Space with more to come in the spring
- Created a legacy tree project for the Lions Park

Roads, Traffic, and Safety Measures

Throughout 2025, the Town ordered and installed new signage, including:

- Four-way stop signs at the Daycare
- Updated truck route signage
- All new street signs as per the Civic Address Registry program (work is still ongoing)

Council also reviewed its Traffic Bylaw, addressing ATVs, weight limits, golf carts, roadway safety, and speed zone adjustments. An SGI Traffic Safety Grant application was submitted for a walking path along Erickson Road, supported by RCMP and resident letters.

Community Safety, Emergency Preparedness, and Protective Services

Emergency management saw significant advancements. The EMO Committee finalized the Town's updated EMO Plan early in the year and modernized Battlebox emergency kits, including adding a secondary Battlebox at the Rec Centre. A regional grant application supported plans for an Emergency Preparedness Day in May.

Regionally, the Town continued its leadership role in Living Sky Regional Emergency Measures Organization, where work began on a comprehensive 17-municipality mutual aid agreement - a major step toward coordinated regional emergency response.

The Town also progressed through fire protection negotiations throughout the year. Planning meetings for a new Fire Hall are ongoing and work has begun on establishing the next steps for the future facility.

In the fall, a restored historical Strasbourg fire truck was donated back to the Town. Arrangements were made to house and insure this important heritage vehicle for future parades and community events.

2025 TOWN YEAR IN REVIEW CONTINUED

Economic Development, Regional Partnerships, and Growth

2025 marked a turning point in regional collaboration. Strasbourg was selected as one of the first areas to participate in Saskatchewan Economic Development Alliance's Saskatchewan Investment Readiness Initiative (SIRI), supporting the restructuring and modernization of the Last Mountain Economic Development Alliance (LMEDA). Workshops, strategic planning sessions, and capacity-building events were hosted throughout the fall, culminating in a regional meeting in Govan in late November.

Development interest in Strasbourg remained strong. Highlights include:

- New deposits on Maple Street subdivision lots
- Continued engineering work on the 111 Mountain Street lot
- A focus group has been created for the development of an Assisted Living Facility

Economic growth also prompted updates to the New Subdivision Lot Policy and initiated discussions for future residential planning.

Community Engagement, Recreation, and Volunteerism

From Hall Committee meetings to strategic planning initiatives, community engagement was a hallmark of the year.

The Hall Comes Back to Life

With the Wall Project finished, the Hall saw a resurgence in programming:

- Fundraising events included Blue Jays games, a Trivia Night, and a Christmas movie evening with more to come in 2026
- A growing volunteer committee
- Upgraded bar area and technical equipment to support events

These efforts are beginning to revitalize the Hall as a community hub.

Spotlight Newsletter & Communications

The Strasbourg Spotlight continued monthly, supported by Strasbourg Connect and website improvements that streamlined communication across the community.

Strategic Planning and Looking Ahead to 2026

A major achievement in 2025 was the initiation of formal municipal strategic planning, with full-day sessions taking place in November. These sessions aimed to establish long-term priorities for infrastructure, economic development, governance, recreation, and community well-being.

Community involvement in the strategic planning will be invited in early 2026 through an open house and engagement opportunities.

With growing partnerships, strengthened infrastructure, and a renewed commitment to long-term planning, Strasbourg enters 2026 with momentum and a clear sense of direction.

Thank you to Council, staff, volunteers, regional partners, and residents who contributed to another meaningful year of progress in our community.


