ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT WEEK MAY 11-17, 2025

It's Economic Development Week in Saskatchewan! The Town of Strasbourg is proud to be a part of the Saskatchewan Economic Development Alliance (SEDA) as well as the Last Mountain Economic Development Alliance (LMEDA) which currently encompasses the municipalities of Nokomis, Govan, and Semans. LMEDA is in its infancy, but is looking to expand to more municipalities and pick up where the Last Mountain Valley Business Association (LMVBA) has left off. We are very grateful for all the work the LMVBA has done over the past few years in encouraging regional economic development.

Why is economic development important? It is important because it leads to increased prosperity and a better quality of life for a community. It generates jobs, boosts tax revenues, and provides opportunities for citizens. Additionally, economic development helps address inequalities and improve social well-being. The Town of Strasbourg is continually striving to address economic development issues and look for ways to improve the community.

The Town of Strasbourg is committed to shopping local and giving back to the businesses and volunteer organizations that exist in our community. In the last three years, the Town has spent just over \$1,081,400 at local businesses and contractors within the area. In the same three years, the Town donated back over \$65,000 to local organizations for events and fundraisers, plus an additional \$25,000 in economic development incentives to new residences and buildings. The Town has a comprehensive economic development incentive policy for both new residential and commercial construction, infill lot construction (including demolition of derelict buildings), and commercial building upgrades on Mountain Street. The Town hires local people to work for the organization, as well as offers student positions within the Public Works Department and at the Museum on an annual basis.

The Town is proud to celebrate Economic Development Week and all the things that make our community a wonderful place to live!

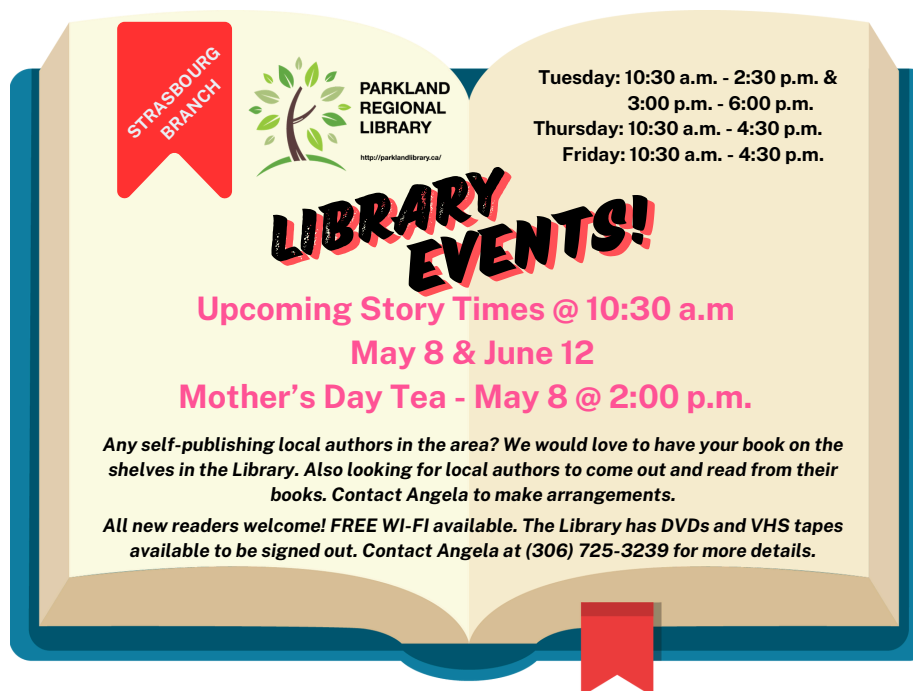
